Review of Membership Applications

Applications for Joint, Associate, and Adjunct membership shall be forwarded to the Director of the Center for initial review and presentation to the Faculty Recruitment Committee of the Center. The committee will make recommendations for appointments at faculty meetings. The final approval for Primary and Joint membership will be granted by the Dean after consideration by the Executive Committee of the Faculty Senate of the School of Medicine. All appointments are made in agreement of regulations of the School of Medicine and any other University-wide appointment regulations.

Initial review of the membership application shall be based primarily on interest in molecular medicine and genetics, and already initiated collaborative research or teaching projects with Primary or Joint members of the Center. Members are expected to actively contribute towards the goals and mission of the Center. Primary and Joint members located in Center space normally allocate 3% of the direct expenses of their external grant support to the maintenance and upgrade of core facilities. Those members who wish to be mentors or co-mentors of graduate students are expected to support the students financially and participate in the teaching of graduate courses. Associate and Adjunct memberships are granted for a four-year term, and renewal of membership shall be based upon productivity and participation in Center activities.

Membership in the Center

Eligibility

The major criterion for membership in the Center is an active interest in research or teaching of molecular medicine or genetics.

Categories of Membership

There are 5 categories of membership in the Center:

1. Primary
2. Joint
3. Associate
4. Adjunct
5. Student

1. Primary membership is conferred upon scientists holding a full and primary academic appointment in the Center, having a major research interest in molecular medicine or genetics, and participating in the day-to-day activities of the Center.

2. Joint membership is conferred upon scientists holding an academic appointment in another department of Wayne State University and having a major research interest in molecular medicine or genetics.

3. Associate membership is conferred upon scientists holding an academic appointment in another department of Wayne State University and having a research interest in molecular medicine or genetics and an on-going research project together with a Primary / Joint member (designated "R"), or a teaching interest in a training grant (designated "TG").

4. Adjunct membership is conferred upon scientists holding an appointment in another research institution and having a research interest in molecular medicine or genetics. The category of Adjunct member is suitable for investigators collaborating with Center investigators.

5. Student membership is conferred upon graduate students working towards Ph.D. degree in a laboratory directed by a Primary or a Joint member of the Center after they have completed their first year of graduate school and passed their qualifying examinations.

- (TG only) ability to be a mentor to students associated with Center training grants
- ability to be a co-mentor, with a Primary or Joint member, to students of the Graduate Program in Molecular Biology and Genetics and other Center educational programs
- regular Center mailings, both electronically and by campus mail, highlighting research seminars and other educational symposia
- reduced admission fees to Center sponsored symposia
- The Center's periodic Newsletter
- other membership privileges as they become available

4. Adjunct Membership includes the following:

- ability to be a co-mentor (together with a Primary or Joint member) to students of the Graduate Program in Molecular Biology and Genetics and other CMMG educational programs
