

CMMG Graduate Student Travel Award

CMMG encourages its students to attend professional meetings to present their work since this is essential for the exchange of scientific ideas and student development. To support student presentations at national and international meetings, CMMG students (up to 4 students per academic year) may receive up to \$400 of support (\$250 from CMMG, \$150 from the School of Medicine*) providing the following criteria are met:

- CMMG student in good academic standing.
- CMMG student must be the first author and main presenter of a presentation at a national or international meeting. This presentation must consist primarily of the student's own work.
- Mentor must match award by CMMG.
- Student may not receive more than one award per academic year.
- Application form with estimated costs must be submitted along with a copy of the meeting abstract at least 6 weeks prior to meeting date.
- Students are required to show proof of applying for any travel support offered by the meeting organizers, and a copy of the accepted abstract before funds will be released.
- A copy of the meeting brochure must accompany the application form.
- Priority for funding will be given to students who have not previously been supported and are nearing the completion of their degree.

*As part of this application students will also be considered for nomination by CMMG to receive the Graduate Student Professional Travel Award (\$150) from the School of Medicine Graduate Programs Office.
